1. What it's NOT

B. Possible Answers:

1. Christ died for all the sins of all people – i.e., all are saved

2. Christ died for some of the sins of all people - i.e., none are actually saved

3. Christ died for all the sins of some people – i.e., some are actually saved
 - Who is this group of people in #3 above?

 - See, e.g., Ro. 8: 28-30: ²⁸And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image

of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. ³⁰And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified.
